A NOTE TO THE TEACHER

To properly use these outlines you must remember that the **THEME** is the purpose of the lesson such as encouraging FELLOWSHIP WITH GOD as in Lesson Number One.

The **TOPIC FOR TODAY** is the subject you will be discussing in order to accomplish the purpose.

The **MEMORY VERSE** can be learned in a group effort at the beginning or the end of the lesson period. You may want to encourage the people to remember it by asking them to repeat it at the next study session. Memorizing scripture is a good way to strengthen your Christian life in order to resist temptations.

FACTS TO LEARN are easy to follow. Have someone read the appropriate scripture and then ask the students to help you answer the question. Spend some time making sure the students understand the correct answer.

The most important parts are **PROBLEMS TO DISCUSS** and **TAKING IT HOME**. This is where you get the student personally involved with the purpose of the lesson. We are interested in more than "Bible Knowledge" when we teach these lessons. We want each student to think deeply about the importance of these Bible truths to his own life. We want each student to take what he has learned and make it a part of his daily life.

You may want to purchase or borrow a copy of the leadership training book on which these lessons are based - *THE CHRISTIAN LIFE*. Better yet, you may want to study the leadership training course yourself in a regular Theological Education by Extension (TEE) course in preparation to teach

these lessons. It is planned that more volumes of lesson outlines will be published based on this book and other leadership training books used in TEE. If you are serious about developing your understanding of God's word so that you can serve more effectively in the Lord's work, then you may want to be a regular student in a TEE program in your area.

I pray that God will bless you and that his Holy Spirit will guide you as you teach these lessons.
